DUI COURT IN SCHOOLS PROGRAM

Raising Awareness

Vehicle crashes are the number one cause of deaths among teens, with the primary collision factor being alcohol. Driving under the influence is dangerous for everyone, especially teenagers. DUI Court in Schools Program provides an interactive experience for our youth by heightening awareness and recognition that teen impaired driving is a real problem that affects real lives.

- **Drunk driving costs the United States \$199 billion dollars a year.**
- **In 2016, 10,497 people were killed and 290,000 were injured in drunk driving crashes.**
- **More than a third of teens mistakenly believe they drive better under the influence of marijuana.**
- **Car crashes are the leading cause of death for teens ages 16-21 with the primary factor being alcohol.**

Presentation Details

Moving an actual DUI sentencing away from a county courthouse to a local high school is a two-prong approach of educating teenagers about the legal consequences of drinking and driving as well as the role and decisions of judicial branch of the government. Students will have an opportunity to directly witness the defendant's arrest, detention, and the imposed fines and penalties. Following the sentencing the judge will make a brief presentation and co-facilitate the interactive portion of the assembly. The intent is to allow for significant dialogue among the students, defendant, judge, attorneys, law enforcement officers, teachers, and special guest. The 90-minute presentation concludes with a dynamic testimony from a victim of a DUI crash.
