# DUI COURT IN SCHOOLS PROGRAM

## Raising Awareness

Vehicle crashes are the number one cause of deaths among teens, with the primary collision factor being alcohol. Driving under the influence is dangerous for everyone, especially teenagers. DUI Court in Schools Program provides an interactive experience for our youth by heightening awareness and recognition that teen impaired driving is a real problem that affects real lives.

- **Alcohol related crashes costs more than \$44 billion a year.**
- **In 2018, 10,511 people were killed in crashes involving alcohol, accounting for 29% of all deadly crashes.**
- **More than a third of teens mistakenly believe they drive better under the influence of marijuana.**
- **Car crashes are the leading cause of death among teens. In 2018, 24% of drivers ages 15-20 killed in crashes had alcohol in their system.**

## Presentation Details

Conducting a DUI sentencing for local high schools is a two-prong approach of educating teenagers about the legal consequences of drinking and driving as well as the role and decisions of judicial branch of the government. Students will have an opportunity to witness a defendant's hearing and imposed sentence and fines. Following the fine and sentencing the judge will make a brief presentation and co-facilitate the interactive portion of the assembly. The intent is to allow for significant dialogue among the students, defendant, judge, attorneys, law enforcement officers, teachers, and special guest.
